MEET MONA

DVRC was called to the field this fall by the Albuquerque Police Department to support Mona*, who was living with her abuser. The Children, Youth, and Families Department had taken custody of her son, and our Advocate was informed that **Mona's abuser was well known for domestic violence** and violence against officers. DVRC quickly helped Mona flee the scene, driving her to our office **where she was given food, clothing, and a hotel room** for a few nights while a shelter placement was made available. The next day, our Advocate even went back to safely retrieve Mona's dogs and put them in boarding for a few weeks. Together, we worked with Mona to create a safety plan, access resources, and leave her abuser for good. **Mona has since regained custody of her son, and we are proud to see her on the road to a better life.**
